The petition of Reinold Sobel formerly Feibisch Sobel hereby filed, respectfully shows:
(1) My place of residence is 28 Barrett Street, Brooklyn, N.Y. (2) My occupation is merchant
(3) I was born in Dolina, Poland on August 13, 1875 My race is Hebrew
(4) I declared my intention to become a citizen of the United States on March 2, 1928 in the U.S. District
Court of Eastern District, at Brooklyn, N.Y.
(5) I am married. The name of my wife or husband is Rather
we were married on February 13, 1898 at Solotwina, Poland; he was
born at New York on April 23, 1878; entered the United States
at New York on April 4, 1929 for permanent residence therein, and now
resides at 28 Barrett Street, Brooklyn, N.Y. I have 8 children, and the name, date,
and place of birth, and place of residence of each of said children are as follows: Rochy, April 28, 1919; Sigmund, December 20,
1901; Max, August 16, 1903; Benjamin, August 30, 1904; Leiser, July 2, 1907; Fischel,
March 1, 1909; Anna, December 19, 1912; Leon, December 3, 1914; all born in Poland
except all reside at 28 Barrett Street, except Leiser who resides in Poland and
Sigmund who resides in Brooklyn
(6) My last foreign residence was Stanislawow, Poland I emigrated to the United States of
America from Southampton, England My lawful entry for permanent residence in the United States
was at New York under the name of February 1, 1928

to organized government. I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy. I am attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States
and well disposed to the good order and happiness of the United States. It is my intention to become a citizen of the United States and to renounce absolutely and
forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to
The Republic of Poland and or The State of Russia
(8) I have resided continuously in the United States of America for the term of five years at least immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since
February 1, 1928 and in the County of Kings
this State, continuously next preceding the date of this petition, since February 1, 1928 being a residence within said county of at least
six months next preceding the date of this petition.
